5. INT. JEFFREY'S HOUSE - JEFFREY'S BEDROOM - AFTERNOON

Jeffrey slams the door. He picks up the newspaper and gazes at Salvatore's obituary.

He closes the paper and tosses it on the desk. He then notices the newspaper headline, which says, "Hundreds Gather for Funeral of Slain Woman."

Jeffrey picks up the paper and studies the title. He smiles.

9. INT. AUNT ROSE'S HOUSE - KITCHEN - AFTERNOON

Aunt Rose takes out a tray of cookies from an oven. Jeffrey hides behind the doorway with a knife behind his back. He suddenly emerges and stabs her repeatedly. As she falls to the floor, she hits the tray, causing the contents to tumble down with her. The cookies become covered with blood.
